NRA Range Safety Officer (RSO) Training Saturday & Sunday May 31-June 1, 2025 @ our Club. The facilitator and instructor for the class is our very own Mike Lipinski, a certified NRA instructor. The NRA Range Safety Officer course is a 14-hour course. You must be at least 21 years old to take this course. The NRA encourages active shooters to learn more and become responsible for the safety of fellow shooters through this program. NRA Range Safety Officer candidates should be experienced shooters who have participated in the various shooting sports. At the successful completion of the class, you will be able to apply to and receive your NRA Range Safety Officer Certificate.

The NRA RSO course will include:

- Introduction to the NRA Basic Range Safety Officer Development Course
- The Role of the NRA Range Safety Officer and Range Standard Operating Procedures
- Range Inspection and Range Rules
- Range Safety Briefing
- Emergency Procedures

Who may participate: This course is available to Mars Rod and Gun Club members who are at least 21 years of age. Participants must be a person of “good repute” and cannot have a criminal history. You will be required to sign an affidavit regarding this.

Dates and Time:

Saturday, May 31, 2025, from 8am-5pm ***You must attend both days to complete this course
Sunday, June 01, 2025, from 11am to 5pm

Cost:

- 1) Mars Rod and Gun will pay the \$50.00 fee for those members who commit to perform RSO duties in support at least two shooting events by December 31 st , 2025.
- 2) For those who cannot commit to support Mars Rod and Gun Club as an RSO, then the fee is \$80.00. A \$20.00 deposit is required for those who sign up for this option.
- 3) To obtain the NRA RSO Identification card there is a fee of \$35.00 payable to the NRA.

The NRA “Refuse to Be a Victim” seminar will be offered at Mars Rod & Gun Club on **Saturday, June 21st from 1:00PM to 5:00PM**. The instructor for the seminar will be Mike Lipinski. This seminar is available for all Mars Rod & Gun members and family members who are at least 18 years of age. This is a non-shooting seminar that will be held in the Mars Rod & Gun clubhouse. The NRA ‘Refuse to Be a Victim ‘is a nationally recognized award-winning

crime prevention program. **Cost:** \$25.00 per person. If a member and spouse attend together, the cost is \$20.00 per person.

The single most important step toward ensuring your own safety is having a personal safety strategy in place before you need it. NRA's "Refuse To Be A Victim"® program teaches the tips and techniques you need to be alerted to dangerous situations and to avoid becoming a victim.

Don't be an easy target. We can all pinpoint times where we've made ourselves an easy target - whether it was keeping our heads buried in our phones, parking in a dimly lit area at night, or leaving our houses or cars unlocked. But there are many more, less obvious situations that make us vulnerable as well. We never think a crime can happen to us, until it does. While sometimes unfortunate things do happen unexpectedly, it is important to be equipped with knowledge and skills for personal safety and crime prevention. Having a personal safety strategy in place and knowing the techniques and tactics you can use to avoid becoming an easy victim can help you live smarter and be safer.
